Connexions can help you

What you can do

- Go to your nearest Connexions centre and tell us what help you want
- Keep in touch so that we can let you know about the latest Apprenticeships and job vacancies
- Use the cnx2jobs service to look at jobs or get your cv updated
- If you have second thoughts about what you want to do, talk to your Personal Adviser about your plans
- If you need extra support we have specialist staff who can offer you advice and guidance



- **Leaving school** - The school leaving date for Year 11 students is the last Friday in June, you can't work full time before that date.
- **Leaving college** - If you're at college you can leave at any time, but it is better to complete your course. If you're not happy with your course and are considering leaving early talk to your Personal Adviser first!
- **Starting work** - You'll need your National Insurance card when you start work. This is normally sent to you when you're about 15 years 9 months. If you're over 16 and haven't received one, or have mislaid it, contact your nearest Social Security office.

Money Matters

Open a bank account - if you haven't already done so, open a basic bank account, you'll need one to be able to apply for EMA, to pay your wages into when you start work or claim benefits.

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) - If you continue in full time education at school or college and your annual household income is under a certain amount you'll be able to apply for an EMA – this could be worth up to £30.00 a week to you. You may also be able to apply for EMA if you go into some types of work based learning like e2e.

Benefits - When you leave Year 11 and are looking for, or waiting to start your Apprenticeship or job, your parent/carer will be able to continue to receive Child Benefit until September. If you're unemployed after that date and have registered at the Connexions centre for work or training your parent/carer can apply for extended Child Benefit. Ask your Personal Adviser for more information.
